Common Terms:

Dinkles- Shoes worn by all band students and are ordered usually during band practice in the spring or at band camp.

Grays- Consist of a T-shirt and shorts worn under the band uniform at all times to protect the band uniform and are ordered at the same time as the dinkles.

Wind Breakers- Lined hooded wind breaker which has the band logo on the back and is a required item for most football games, parades and competitions and are ordered with the dinkles and grays.

Gloves and Socks- Black gloves and socks are worn every time the uniform is worn and may be ordered with the dinkles, grays etc.

Summer Uniform- Consists of Black dress pants (Cargo pants and pants with pockets or zippers at the knees are NOT acceptable) and a Red 'Band' Polo shirt. Polo shirts are ordered with the dinkles, grays etc.

Guard Uniform- Consists of the actual performance uniform, matching body suit and a running suit for before and after performances.

Drill- The actual movement from one place on the field to another done in the form of 'Sets' or pictures of what the show is to look like at any given time.

Welcome

We are the Cumberland Valley Band Boosters. And we would like to thank you for taking the opportunity to understand both the Cumberland Valley Marching Band and the Band Boosters role in creating a successful music program.

WHO ARE THE BAND BOOSTERS

The Cumberland Valley Band Boosters (CVBB) is organized to support the Music Department of our high school. Parents of band members are automatically included as Band Boosters. It is however, not necessary to have a student in the band to be an active Booster. Anyone interested in supporting the Music Department of the high school may join. Our main functions are fund-raising and support. The Band Boosters manage an annual budget in order to support the Marching Band Program, Indoor and Outdoor Guard Programs and the overall Music Department. We do not make any policy decisions for the band or band staff.

Since the Marching Band activities are costly and not completely covered by the School Board Budget, it is primarily a self-funded program overseen by the CVBB. Being that CVBB is a support function for the Marching Band, it is responsible for an annual budget that raises money to support the Marching Band through Concession stands, Fry Wagon events and numerous other fundraisers. The money we raise helps supply the marching band with equipment, props, trucks and the trailers needed to transport organization to competitions and football games, and other events.

The information on the following pages will familiarize you with our organization, its functions, projects, and committees. Because the band is so large, it is difficult to contact everyone personally. Any questions you may have can be directed to any Band Booster Officer, Mentor, Committee Chairperson, Band Director or the Asst Band Director.

The CVBB Constitution and By-laws can be found on the web site www.cvhs-band.org. Our year runs from January 1 through December 31. Election of Officers is held in December of each year and they assume their duties in January.

Supporting the Marching Band

The Cumberland Valley Band Boosters (CVBB) is an active organization creating a positive experience for our students by supporting the Marching Band/Indoor and Outdoor Guard program. **This takes many parents helping** to maintain the activities that generate the funds to make this a successful outcome. Our organization has some general fundraising programs that are successful sources of revenue for the CVBB.

Mentoring Program

The Cumberland Valley Band Booster (CVBB) Mentoring Program's purpose is to support and enhance the overall experience of the band members and their families and increase adult volunteerism.

The main goal of this program is to provide new band parents with a guided introduction to the Cumberland Valley Band Booster organization and associated events, activities, and support requirements. It also provides these parents with opportunities to make their own positive contributions to the organization. Entering a new organization requires a transitional period for anyone. Those who succeed in crossing this bridge usually do so with the support of those who have been there before. Developing a network of supportive peers is crucial to success in any organization but may be a challenge at the beginning. Getting started on this process may be an even greater challenge for parents who have never been involved with a band organization. This mentoring program facilitates the new band parent's inclusion in the Band Booster's culture and values the member's contribution to the organization.

Participation in this program is voluntary for both mentors and new band parents.

'Concession Stands' at the Football Stadium

The Concession Stands were built by the CV Band Booster organization. They are open for all home Varsity Games, other sports events in the stadium, and the CV Band Competition, 'Echoes in the Valley'. **They are staffed by parents of the band/guard members** and sell a wide variety of hot & cold food, drinks, and snacks.

Why are we at the other sporting events selling food?

There are many sporting events going on at a community level within the school district. Softball, Baseball, Soccer Tournaments, etc. are sports groups and are not set-up to run food concessions. Because we are, CVBB is often requested to handle the food concessions.

What is Echoes in the Valley?

Commonly referred to as Echoes, is the marching band competition hosted by the CV Marching Band on a Saturday evening in September or October at the CV Football field. The students practice their show in the afternoon and later are served dinner courtesy of CVBB. At the event, the students are hosts to other schools and give the closing performance to the competition. Meanwhile, the parents work the concession stands, escort the visiting bands, sell programs, admission tickets, candy-grams, flower-grams, buttons, and coordinate the judges and feed them too. We need everyone's help!

What is the 'Fry Wagon'?

The infamous Fry Wagon is another way of raising money for the CV Band Booster yearly budget. The Fry Wagon is **staffed by parents of band/guard students** and is at all the Home Varsity Football games, Silver Spring Wal-Mart on various weekends, and numerous other CV Athletic & community events through out the year. The Fry Wagon is staffed by CVBB and sells French fries, chicken fingers, and on occasion, hot dogs, sausages, hamburgers, water, soda, and candy.

What other types of general fundraising do you do?

In the past we have sold Ads on the side of our uniform trailer and fry wagon, t-shirts and sweatshirts, held a basket bingo, raffle ticket sales, and chicken dinner events. These are just examples of opportunities we take to meet our annual budget. Any ideas are greatly appreciated.

Volunteers

Volunteering is an important aspect in the operation of the CVBB organization. *The success our volunteers have in effectively running events throughout the year provides our students with the best times of their lives. Volunteering should demonstrate to our children the importance and understanding that committing our time for them and others is a valuable reward in of its self.*

What is a 'Student Account'?

The Student Account is where the students' Fund Raising money is credited. We do not have a participation fee as some organizations however any student who chooses to raise funds via the Student Fund Raisers will split the profit 80/20 with 80% going to the student and the remaining 20% to the 'Booster' general fund to help defray costs. The money, held within this account, is to be used for the student's purposes only. The student accounts can be used for such things as sponsored Major Marching band trips, mandatory apparel and the Band Banquet just to name a few. The Student Account program is explained in detail in the CVBB By-Laws. To maintain a student account you must be in 8th grade or higher. Seniors must liquidate their accounts by the end of April of their senior year, if not liquidated; any balance will be transferred into the Boosters' General Fund. If a student does not return to marching band the next season, their account must be liquidated by September 30th; i.e., a student participated as a freshman, elected not to participate as a sophomore, they must liquidate their account by September 30th of their sophomore year if not liquidated by September 30th any balance will be transferred into the Boosters' General fund.

Options for liquidation are the following:

- Transfer to general fund
- Transfer to benevolent fund
- Transfer to any budget line item
- Transfer to another active marching band member

What is the 'Band Trip'?

The Band Trip is usually during a Holiday Break every other year, 2006, 2008, etc. While all trips require School Board approval, it is completely funded by the students & CVBB. The band participates in a competition or parade chosen by the Band Director, somewhere in the US, during Christmas or Thanksgiving break this year we will be traveling during the Thanksgiving break. We schedule the trip for 1 week and include sightseeing events as well. Chaperones pay their own way.

Fundraisers

We raise money to fund two separate band accounts:

1. **GENERAL ACCOUNT.** We fund the general account to pay for our annual band expenses – estimated at \$67,000 for this year. Listed are several examples of estimated, annual recurring expenses funded from the General Account:

- Salaries staff \$27,000
- Truck and trailer gas and maintenance \$3500
- Insurance \$4000
- Annual audit \$3000
- Field show and support equipment \$3000
- Uniform maintenance \$2500
- Band banquet \$1400
- Instrument maintenance \$1000
- Instrument Replenishment \$1500

To fund this \$67,000 a year budget, we manage and run the concessions and fry wagon at football games and our annual band competition (Echoes in The Valley); we take the fry wagon on the road during the off season to local community events; and we sell concessions at our annual indoor show in spring. In addition we hold a large chicken barbecue during band camp in August, garner donations from local restaurants during monthly band nights, and stage car washes in spring and fall. Lastly, 20% of the profit from the student fundraisers also supplement the General Account.

2. **STUDENT ACCOUNT.** Our treasurer establishes a student account for each marching band member. Your student's account pays for personal expenses such as the band trip, band banquet, and some clothing articles. Essentially your student sells a product over a two to three week period and 80% of their profit goes to their individual student account. We hold approximately 12 student fundraisers throughout the year with a wide variety of products offered. Additional opportunities to fund student accounts include selling ads for Echoes In The Valley (75%) and the purchase of grocery cards (5%). The student account balance is carried over from year to year until graduation. Student account information is available each month at the general booster meeting for your review to ensure the account balance matches your records.

All Upcoming General and Student fundraisers for 2009 will be advertised to you via our All-CVHS-Band E-mail Distribution, The CVMB Web-Site, and at all monthly CVBB Meetings. They will be explained in greater detail at those times.

8th Grade Parents-All fund-raiser brochures can be picked up from the Middle School Band Directors prior to the end of the school year in June however the Fund Raiser orders and check must be turned in to the individual in charge of that particular Fund raiser or the order must be turned in to the locked fund raiser box located in the High School Band room. The middle school band directors are not responsible for turning in any fund raiser orders for the marching band.

Marching Band Fundraising

STUDENT FUNDRAISERS

TYPICAL STUDENT FUNDRAISER: To help defray the cost for your son or daughter, consider participating in a **student** fundraiser. They help to pay for:

- The 2010 CV Marching Band Trip
- Clothing – Windbreaker, polo shirt, gloves, shoes etc
- Band Banquet, trophies, drum major camp and more

Students sell a product over a two to three week period. 80% of the profit goes to your student's account. About 12 are held during the year. Upcoming student fundraisers include:

- June - Bruster's Ice Cream (80%)
- August – Kettle Korn

ECHOES ADS: Another student fundraiser is selling program ads to local businesses and organizations for our annual CV Marching Band Competition; it's named Echoes in The Valley. This year our date is Saturday October 17 2009 so students are busy selling ads in July and August. Students net 75% of the Echoes ads that they sell!

GROCERY CARDS: Ongoing Giant, Karns, and Weis Food Gift Cards (5% of total purchase). Contact Lisa Kishbaugh for details.
